Year Six Report Penney Clark, Director April 2014

This report highlights THEN/HiER activities between April 1, 2013 and March 31, 2014.

THEN/HiER is the first pan-Canadian organization devoted to promoting—and improving—history teaching and learning by bringing together the multiple and varied constituencies involved in history education: academic historians; public historians in museums, archives and historic sites; practicing teachers; history education scholars; and curriculum policy-makers. Our goal is to create more research-informed practice (from kindergarten to graduate school) and more practice-informed research through engagement involving these various communities.

Project Goals Stated in SSHRC Proposal (November 2007)

- Nurture a community of inquiry among academic historians; public historians in museums, archives and historic sites; practicing teachers; researchers based in faculties of education; graduate students; policy makers and other stakeholders.
- Provide opportunities for engagement with, and critique of, existing research in the field of history education, with the aim of bridging research and practice.
- Encourage research in classrooms involving collaboration between academics and teachers.
- Transform classroom practice through pro-active connections with ministries of education, textbook publishers, other curriculum developers, and practicing teachers. We will collaboratively develop textbook publications, teacher resource materials and on-line museum-based activities and other digital resources, for schools.
- Disseminate current Canadian and international research on history education out of the universities to broader communities of stakeholders.
- Establish and nurture fertile research connections with international stakeholders.
- Engage in the development of authentic approaches to assessment of students' historical literacy through a partnership with the Benchmarks of Historical Thinking project (now the Historical Thinking Project), developed by the Centre for the Study of Historical Consciousness, UBC. Well conceived assessments, in conjunction with curriculum materials and professional development, are a powerful driver of the reform of history education itself.

Project Goals Modified in Years One and Two

The current goals as outlined on our website (http://thenhier.ca/en/content/about) are as follows:

- 1. Create a more robust history education **research** culture in Canada as defined by:
 - increasing opportunities for collaboration among scholars, educators, and other stakeholders
 - increasing the circulation of Canadian and international research findings
- 2. Improve history education **policy** across Canada by:
 - promoting research on history education policy
 - promoting research-informed history education policy
 - nurturing dialogue among education stakeholders (including academic historians; public historians in museums, archives and historic sites; practicing teachers; researchers based in faculties of education; graduate students; policy makers and other stakeholders) about history education policy
- 3. Improve history education **practice** by:
 - increasing communication and collaboration among history education stakeholders
 - disseminating research findings in educational settings
 - encouraging teachers to apply history education research
 - identifying and nurturing communities of practitioners
 - promoting informed uses of new media within history education
- 4. Develop research-informed **assessment** of history learning by:
 - promoting research on history assessment
 - disseminating research on assessment among policy makers and teachers
- 5. Provide advocacy by:
- serving as a public voice for history education in Canada
- generating research-informed policy briefs

The Executive Board held eight meetings over the course of the year, including one face-to-face meeting in December 2013, which was a two-day retreat held at the Granville Island Hotel in Vancouver. The other seven meetings were held by teleconference in intervening months (April, May, June, September, October, 2013; and January and March, 2014).

Facilities

THEN/HiER continues to share office space with the Centre for the Study of Historical Consciousness (one of its partners) at the University of British Columbia. The Department of Curriculum and Pedagogy, UBC, provides an office for Penney Clark, THEN/HiER Director.

Support Staff

Network Manager, Anne Marie Goodfellow, was hired in December 2008 and continues to work on a full-time basis. Anne Marie is the only full-time employee attached to the Network and handles both major projects and day-to-day activities, including administration of the interactive website, and writing the monthly *e-Bulletin* and the *Annual Review*. She also keeps promotional

materials up to date, disseminates information about THEN/HiER to our partners and the public, supervises graduate student research assistants, assists in organizing our Annual Regional Conference and other conferences, and organizes the Vancouver *Approaching the Past* series.

Webmaster/Administrative Assistant, Ulrike Spitzer, was hired in October 2008 and works one and one-half days per week. Much of her time is spent on administrative tasks including the financial operation of the organization. She also uploads materials to the website.



Communication Banners (goals 1 and 3)

We continue to display our bilingual banners at conferences and THEN/HiER events. The banners have images from two of our partners, Parks Canada and the Museum of Vancouver.

Pamphlets (goals 1 and 3)

Our brochure and other pamphlets related to our funding programs are regularly updated and available at conferences and presentations attended by THEN/HiER Board members and upon request. All pamphlets are bilingual and include a QR (Quick Response) Code to our website. A bilingual poster of THEN/HiER funding opportunities was created this year and sent out with the *Annual Review*. We also developed a flyer for the THEN/HiER book series.

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e-Bulletin and Annual Review (goals 2 and 3)



We continue to publish our *Annual Review* at the end of the fiscal year. It is sent to all members and partner organizations on the THEN/HiER listserv (over 1,200). In order to save costs on envelopes and postage, we decided this year not to send hard copies to members by mail. However, we will continue to print copies as needed for events such as conferences. The *Annual Review* highlights activities from the previous year's *e-Bulletins* in order to provide a summary of important activities over the course of the year. THEN/HiER Website (goals 1, 2, 3, and 4)

We have kept the existing content categories on the website which is updated on a regular basis. In addition, the following changes were made to the website:

- We revised the database of abstracts of books and articles on teaching which complements our database of abstracts on research resources. There were about 200 teaching abstracts in the database at the end of the fiscal year.
- We added a "Controversies" webpage available through the homepage main menu to keep visitors informed about current controversies in history education with links to articles on specific issues.
- Another new page is for recent books on history education and the history of education.

We also held a Blog Contest for people to write a blog on a major controversy in history education. First prize went to Cynthia Wallace-Casey for her article "Keeping It Real," which discusses the debate about changing the name of the Canadian Museum of Civilization to the Canadian Museum of History. Second prize winner Mary Chaktsiris wrote "Renewed History Wars: 21st Century Commemoration in Canada," which addresses the issue of commemoration in Canadian history education.

Google Analytics reports relating to various aspects of our website that compare the 2012/13 and 2013/14 fiscal years are included as an appendix.

We continue to use the services of UBC-IT for website troubleshooting. Our website is hosted through Funio.

THEN/HiER's 4th Annual Regional Conference brought together graduate students, professors, teachers, museum educators and community members on October 7, 2013. Topics included issues of historical consciousness; indigenous knowledges; and inclusive, community-based museology. In addition to speakers, there were break-out sessions led by graduate students which explored how museums can connect with social studies/history curricula and historical

consciousness, using multiple perspectives in history education, indigenous histories, and the practices of participatory museology.

Battle Lines in the Schools: Teaching the History of War and Society for the Common Good Public lecture sponsored by the Gregg Centre for the Study of War and Society, held at the Beaverbrook Art Gallery in Fredericton (New Brunswick) on October 15, 2013. Grade 7 Historical Inquiry Unit: Connect Charter School

With the help of a Small Projects Grant from THEN/HiER, David Scott collaborated with Jody Pereverzoff and Chris Dittmann from Connect Charter School (formally Calgary Science School) to develop a historical inquiry unit for their 100 grade 7 students. As outlined in this video, Jody and Chris were interested in exploring the question: "How can we help people learn more about historically significant events in Canada's past in a way that will be both interesting and also show the relevance of history to their lives?"

The status of our publications as of March 31, 2014:

Pastplay: Teaching and Learning History with Technology

This book, edited by **Kevin Kee**, is based on the symposium *Playing with Technology in History* which took place on April 29 and 30, 2010. Kevin has sent out a call to contributors for permission to use images in their chapters and is waiting for their responses. The next step will be copy-editing.

Becoming a History Teacher: Sustaining Practices in Historical Thinking and Knowing **Ruth Sandwell** and **Amy von Heyking** are co-editing this book based on chapters presented at *The Many Faces of History Teacher Education* symposium which took place on April 28 and 29, 2011. Ruth and Amy have responded to reviewer comments and added a conclusion to the manuscript before resubmitting it to University of Toronto Press. They will also be applying for an ASPP grant.

Museums as Sites of Historical Consciousness

The manuscript for this book, based on the *Museums as Sites of Historical Consciousness* symposium on April 11 and 12, 2012, is co-edited by **Viviane Gosselin** and Phaedra Livingstone of the University of Oregon. Viviane and Phaedra are completing the introduction and plan to submit the manuscript in mid-April, 2013.

Assessing Historical Thinking

Peter Seixas and Kadriye Ercikan, Professor in Educational Psychology at UBC, co-editors, have a preliminary section and chapter summary for this volume which is based on some of the presentations at the 2013 Historical Thinking Project Annual Meeting, January 15 to 17, with additional chapters by other authors. It will be a volume for researchers and large-scale test designers rather than history teachers, and will have an international flavour with contributors from the United States, Europe, and Australia.

Historical Representations in the Arts: A Cross-Disciplinary Inquiry

Alan and **Penney**, co-editors, worked together for two days prior to the December 2013 retreat on a preliminary proposal for their book on the intersections among art, history and pedagogy. The book will be centred on teaching and learning history for an educated and academic general audience, and will represent a crossover between history education and art and may include international as well as Canadian perspectives.

It was decided that the Advocacy Committee, headed by Stéphane Lévesque, would provide items for our new "Controversies" page. Other Board members can also contribute items to this page. Board members may also express their opinions on issues related to history education but, due to different perspectives among Board members, THEN/HiER will not become involved in these as an organization.

Graduate Students (goals 1 and 3)

THEN/HiER has made substantial contributions to graduate students, both financially and in terms of their scholarly endeavours.

Employment

We continued to employ Erika Smith, student in the Master's of Museum Education program in the UBC Department of Curriculum and Pedagogy, to search for and write abstracts for our website and assist with the Vancouver *Approaching the Past* series. Her appointment began in September 2012 and was renewed from April to July 2013. In September 2013 we hired Emily Chicorli, Master's student in Archival Studies, under a Work/Study program, to write abstracts. Her appointment will end April 30, 2014.

Graduate Student Committees

Kate Zankowicz, doctoral candidate at OISE/UofT, continued to coordinate the Anglophone Graduate Student Committee and Marie-Hélène Brunet, doctoral candidate at the Université de Montréal, continued to coordinate the Francophone Graduate Student Committee.

The Graduate Student Committee coordinators are responsible for the following:

- coordinating committee members who act as representatives in their respective regions;
- holding regular teleconference meetings with committee members;
- participating in regular THEN/HiER Board meetings;
- coordinating and maintaining THEN/HiER blogs (the English blog *Teaching the Past* and the French blog *Enseigner l'histoire*);
- maintaining THEN/HiER Facebook and Twitter pages;

- updating the Graduate Student Committee website pages;
- organizing the annual regional conference;
- organizing series of local events.

Annual Regional Conference

THEN/HiER's Anglophone Graduate Student Committee organized this year's Annual Regional Conference which took place on October 7, 2013 at the UBC Museum of Anthropology in Vancouver. Topics included issues of historical consciousness; indigenous knowledges; and inclusive, community-based museology. In addition to speakers, there were break-out sessions led by graduate students which explored how museums can connect with social studies/history curricula and historical consciousness, using multiple perspectives in history education, indigenous histories, and the practices of participatory museology.

Series of Local Events

Approaching the Past – Toronto

Rose Fine-Meyer and **Kate Zankowicz**, along with a board made up of representatives of Toronto-area history educators, organized the series *Approaching the Past* in Toronto. Here are summaries of the different events that took place during the 2013/14 fiscal year:

Toronto: Multiple Voices, Multiple Lives – May 1, 2013

This event took place at the City of Toronto Archives, Casa Loma, and Spadina House. Archives staff demonstrated their Ward-based programming that focuses on how the area known as The Ward was represented visually over time. Sarah Bassnett, curator of the exhibit, spoke about the many lenses used to "picture" the Ward and explained how her exhibit was organized by various publications, including community-based newspapers, the *Toronto Globe*, and municipal photographs. The exhibit demonstrated how the images of immigrants were used in different ways. At Spadina House, led by Doug Fyfe, Program Officer, participants role-played particular interest groups to ask the wealthy Austin family for financial support. Mr. Fyfe also shared with us the story of the rise and fall of Sir Henry Pellat, Toronto entrepreneur and owner of Casa Loma.

Picturing Toronto On and Off the Grid – October 2, 2013

This event was held at the City of Toronto Archives. The exhibition on display was "Toronto on the Grid" which included 100 years of street photography. Participants, mostly teachers and teacher candidates, were introduced to using primary documents such as photos in their classrooms. Stewart Boden of the Ontario Archives did a presentation titled "Lights Camera Archives" and gave CDs of the historical footage from his presentation to all participants.

Exploring Landscapes of Leisure – November 5, 2013

This event took place at Colborne Lodge in High Park. It began with a tour of historic Colborne Lodge (a historical museum built in 1836 by John George Howard, an architect and engineer), and was followed by two talks. The first talk by museum educator Catherine Raven provided insight into the history and geography of the land and environment of the park. Her presentation included beautiful images of the park, the historic house, and the Toronto Waterfront. For the second talk, Toronto teacher Katy Whitfield showed photographic evidence of the diverse uses

of the park's land as an important historic space, and distributed a special package of materials she created for participants that incorporated historical thinking concepts.

Going to War: How Torontonians Experienced World War I – February 17

This was a video of historian Mary Chaktsiris answering questions from history educators about engaging students in the local history of Toronto during the First World War.

Approaching the Past – Vancouver

The Vancouver *Approaching the Past* series is organized by **Anne Marie Goodfellow**, Network Manager, rather than graduate students.

A Walking Tour of Stanley Park – May 30, 2013

This tour was led by Jolene Cumming of the Stanley Park History Group. Participants viewed some historical sites within the park, which at one time was inhabited by First Nations and later by European newcomers. Ms. Cumming showed historical photographs of many of the sites.

Musqueam Nation – October 7, 2013

The next event was held in conjunction with THEN/HIER's 4th Annual Regional Conference. Terry Point of the Musqueam Cultural Centre provided a guided tour of the Musqueam community, longhouse, and the cultural centre, with a focus on a joint Musqueam-Maori exhibition.

In an effort to encourage others to set up *Approaching the Past* series in various cities throughout Canada, a guide is posted on our website on the THEN/HiER Events and General Instructional Resources pages (http://thenhier.ca/sites/default/files/ATP-guidelines.docx).

Graduate Student Funding Programs Visiting Doctoral Student Program

This program provides an opportunity for doctoral students enrolled in a Canadian university to visit a Faculty of Education or History Department in another university for a two-week period to work with a faculty member sponsor. The adjudication committee (Catherine Duquette, Viviane Gosselin and Amy von Heyking) made two awards in Year Five for exchanges which will take place in Year Six and Year Seven. Student reports about their exchanges will appear on the website.

- Scott Pollock, OISE/UT, is investigating how, and to what extent, historical thinking became embedded in Ontario's new secondary history curricula. He will be working with Drs. Penney Clark and Peter Seixas, Department of Curriculum and Pedagogy, UBC.
- Jane Griffith, Faculty of Education, York University, will be doing archival research on Aboriginal student newspapers in order to reconsider the creation myths of Canada. She will be working with **Dr. Dwayne Donald**, Faculty of Education, University of Alberta.

Graduate Student Projects Program

This program supports projects related to history teaching and learning in Canada initiated, organized, and carried out by graduate students in history and history education. We consider requests for support up to a maximum of \$2,500. THEN/HiER did not receive any project proposals during this fiscal year.

Collaborative Projects (goals 1 and 3) Small Projects Grants Program

Each year, this program funds up to ten small projects related to history teaching and learning in Canada to a maximum of \$2,500 each. In 2013/14 our adjudication committee consisted of Executive Board members **Penney Clark**, **Marg Conrad** and **Peter Seixas**, as well as Rose Fine-Meyer. This year six projects were approved for funding.

The Inverness Interactive Archives Project

This project, conducted in collaboration with the Inverness Miners Museum and Inverness Historical Society, will involve the creation of an interactive online history database, through which students and the general public can research the community of Inverness, Nova Scotia. The project organizers became aware of this funding opportunity through the 2012 *Annual Regional Conference* in Halifax.

Understanding Atrocities: Remembering, Representing and Teaching Genocide

THEN/HiER provided funding to support student participation in this conference which was designed to share new scholarship and teaching perspectives on the global, transhistorical problem of genocide. The students will submit blog posts to the THEN/HiER website reflecting on their participation in the conference which took place February 19 to 21, 2014 at Mount Royal University in Calgary.

Discipline-Based Inquiry in the Alberta Social Studies Classroom: A Digital Resource Guide for Practicing and Pre-Service Teachers

This teacher's guide seeks to provide insight into how the eight principles of the Galileo Educational Network's Discipline-based Rubric for Inquiry Studies can enhance the conceptual framework of historical thinking articulated by **Peter Seixas** and colleagues at The Historical Thinking Project. The ePub iBook can be downloaded for free from the iTunes store http://www.apple.com by searching: *Enhancing Historical Thinking Through Discipline-based Inquiry: A Teacher's Resource* by David Scott.

The Graphic History Project

The aim of The Graphic History Project is to inspire people to get involved, on a volunteer basis, in the making of activist comics. Through this SPG, the GHC has been able to offer contributors a small honorarium, recognizing the countless hours of work that goes into crafting every comics page. Second, the GHC was able to upgrade their website to improve its overall readability and better feature the new comics. Lastly, curriculum development for the Graphic History Project will eventually accompany each completed comic in the planned edited collection. Developing this curriculum will help facilitate educators' greater engagement with the comics of the Graphic History Project and encourage a deeper connection to each project.

Le Bataillon acadien de la Première Guerre mondiale - élaboration d'activités pédagogiques et présentation d'ateliers

This project on the Acadian battalion of World War I will offer francophone students in New Brunswick greater access to the history of Acadian soldiers who volunteered for the war. Through various educational activities, students will discover aspects of Acadian history related to the war, including the creation of the 165th infantry battalion.

Canadian History In-School Experiences, Program and Audience Development.

The Manitoba Museum will develop five programs, some bilingual, for the Grade 11 Canadian History curriculum using historical thinking concepts and primary sources (artefacts, photographs and archival documents).

An additional three proposals were not considered suitable because they did not meet our criteria. Funding recipients are required to submit a report of project outcomes, available on our website at http://thenhier.ca/en/content/small-project-grants-reports.

Publication Award

Due to an insufficient number of eligible nominations, no prize was awarded in 2013.
