## *What's new with THEN/HiER?*



\* **Executive Board member Stéphane Lévesque**, along with Sharon Cook, Lorna McLean and Tim Stanley from the University of Ottawa were awarded an Educational Research Unit (ERU) entitled *Making History: Narratives and Collective Memory in Education/Faire de l'histoire : Récits et mémoires collectives en éducation*. The ERU will advance the production of historical knowledge by providing a site for collaborative, bilingual research into the history of education, focusing on the Outaouais Region, and the University of Ottawa's role within it.



\* **Executive Board member and doctoral candidate in the UBC Faculty of Education, Viviane Gosselin**, is currently examining the nature of historical thinking stimulated through the production and public reception of museum exhibitions. To collect data for her study she recently conducted interviews with museum staff and visitors at the McCord Museum of Canadian History's exhibition entitled "Being Irish O'Quebec." More about this research will appear in our fall *Newsletter*.

\* **Penney Clark, Director**, was interviewed for a special edition of *The Beaver* dealing with educational issues. Details will be provided in our fall *Newsletter*.

\* **Small Projects Grants**. The MedSTEP (Medieval Studies Teaching Experience Program) was successfully completed at Wifrid Laurier University in Waterloo, Ontario. Medieval Studies students delivered a one-day program to 84 grade 11 students from four local high schools. THEN/HiER funds paid for supply teachers, transportation, and food for the program.

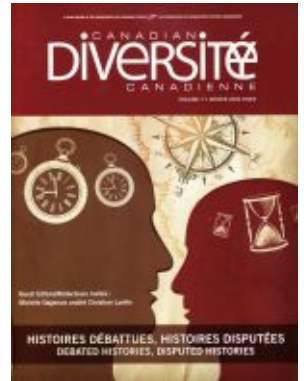
