Title: Micro History, Macro Interpretation, and Mass Schooling:
Understanding Canada @ 150

Abstract: In recent decades, scholars have re-interpreted formal and informal education in Canada primarily by analyzing diverse and complex individual, family, and community experiences within the overall trajectory of increasing school attendances. At the same time, such micro-historical studies redefined the study of school and society as essential to the building of macro interpretations of historical change. The approaching sesquicentennial offers a unique opportunity to offer such interpretations as illustrated by recent research on schooling in the making of modern Canada.

The CAFE Keynote Address will be delivered by Dr. Chad Gaffield, University Chair in Digital Scholarship at the University of Ottawa and Past President of the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada.
