

## Read - Review - Respond Blog Event

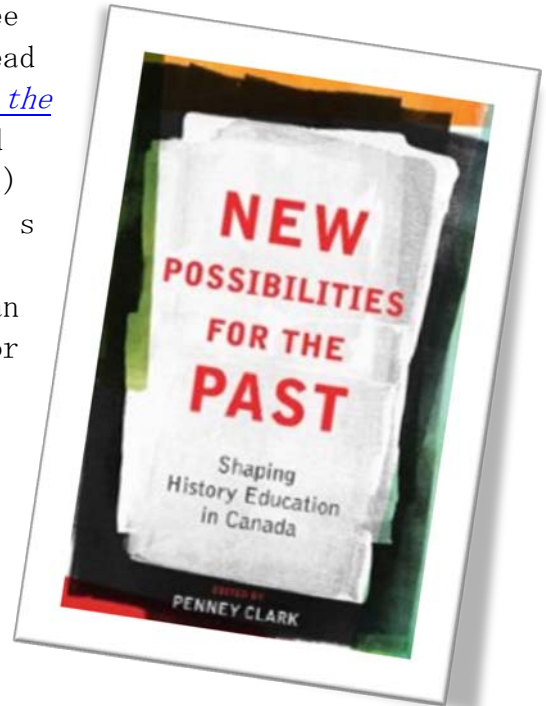
### Conversations on *New Possibilities for the Past*

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Interested in reading *New Possibilities for the Past* and having a conversation about it?

THEN/HiER is hosting a blog “event” where three graduate students will have an opportunity to read the new edited collection [\*New Possibilities for the Past: Shaping History Education in Canada\*](#) edited by Penney Clark and published by UBC Press (2011) and have an e-conversation about the collection’s strengths, weaknesses, and ways to bring the ideas forward. One student will also interview an author in (or editor of) the collection as his or her weekly contribution.

The e-conversation will roll out in a four week blog ‘event’ beginning March 26 that will be published on our [website](#) and publicized through [Facebook](#).



Questions to frame these posts will be:

- Are the “new possibilities for the past” something that is unique for Canada or are these “new possibilities” important for our larger, transnational world?
- Is our conception of history education “evolving” or is today’s focus simply a historical trend once again in vogue?
- What does author feel is the most pressing issue in Canadian history education today? How does s/he address this issue in her/his work? How does this fit with the themes and issues brought out by other scholars? (*podcast*)
