### *What's new with THEN/HiER?*



- \* An article about THEN/HiER will appear in the July issue of *Museums Roundup*, a publication of the BC Museums Association.
- \* THEN/HiER did a presentation at the Museums Association of Saskatchewan's *Arts, Culture & Heritage Research Symposium*. The theme of the symposium was community-based collaborative research.
- \* Small Projects Grants Program. Since our April newsletter, we have approved funding for two projects: *Online Jewish Western Bulletin Digitization and Access Project* (Jewish Museum and Archives of BC), which involves the development, in partnership with educators and students, of an education program associated with the digitized content to enable educators to easily access the online materials; and *Curriculum Connections* (Great Unsolved Mysteries in Canadian History), which will assist history educators in Canada by clearly showing, for each province or territory, the GUMICH learning materials that pertain to curricula for their area. More details will appear in our October newsletter.
- \* Visiting Doctoral Student Program. Catherine Duquette from Université Laval has successfully completed her visit with Dr. Peter Seixas at the Centre for the Study of Historical Consciousness at the University of British Columbia, which was announced in our April newsletter. While there she worked on, among other things, an article for *The Beaver* magazine about using historical thinking concepts in the classroom. More detailed reports about her visit and other doctoral student visits will appear on our website in September and in our October newsletter.
