war. Today, that victory is widely embraced as a turning point in Canadian history, a major step in Canada's evolution as a nation.

This annual scholarship provides students with a spectacular two-week learning experience in Europe. Guided by Canadian and European experts in England, Belgium and France, students attend seminars at Oxford, and visit the iconic Vimy War Memorial and other historic battlefields and gravesites.

Candidates must be 15-17 years old and must meet the following criteria:

- · Canadian, British or French citizen.
- Grade average of at least 75%.
- Enrolled in grade 10 or 11 (Born in 1994/95/96).
- · Working knowledge of English and French.
- Future leader and proven team player.
- Sincere interest in history.

Must be below the age of 18 in August 2011.

The application includes two essay questions. one of which is a research essay, the other a commentary on a work of art from the Beaverbrook Art collection in the online Canadian War Museum. All finalists must pass an interview with the Foundation's selection committee.

Former winners tell us their best memories are those of meeting veterans, historians, scholars and specialists on the ground. Their visits to Vimy Ridge, diverse cemeteries and battlefields, strike a powerful chord, as they experience history firsthand. It is a life-changing opportunity that makes Canadian history come alive, inspiring our young people so that they never forget.
